LESSONS FROM RICK JOYNER'S BOOK "THE FINAL QUEST"

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Recap of previous lesson (Wisdom &The Prerequisite)

- 1. Wisdom is the principal thing; all things one may desire cannot be compared with her (Proverbs 4:7, 8:11). Therefore we need to pursue wisdom above every other thing.
- 2. Wisdom is the primary gift that God gives us for our work.
- 3. Wisdom is a Person the Lord Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 1:30), who can choose to manifest in any form: as an angel, as a person we know, or as a stranger
- 4. He can speak through anybody including 'babes', the base and the lowly.
- 5. Because wisdom is the Person of Jesus, we attain wisdom first and foremost by seeking Jesus; and secondly by being humble enough to recognize Him in any form He chooses to come.

Today's Topic: BALANCED LIVING

Wisdom speaking: "It is wisdom to love . . . It is also wisdom to behold the <u>kindness and severity</u> of God. It is wisdom to love Him and to fear Him. You are in deception if you do otherwise."

"Just as there is a time to plant and a time to reap," Wisdom continued, "There are times to adore the Lord, and there are times to honor Him with the greatest fear and respect. It is wisdom to know that time for each. True wisdom knows the times and seasons of God. I brought you here because it was time to worship the Lord in the glory of His love. This is what you needed the most after such a battle. I am now taking you to another place because it is time for you to worship Him in the fear of His judgment. Until you know both, there is a danger that we can be separated from each other."

"Do you mean that if I had stayed back there in that glorious worship I would have lost you?" I asked in disbelief?

"Yes. I would have always visited with you when I could, but we would have rarely crossed paths. Although it is hard to leave such glory and peace, that is not the whole revelation of the King. He is both a Lion and a Lamb. To the spiritual children, He is the Lamb. To the maturing, He is a Lion. To the fully mature, He is both the Lion and the Lion"

We need balance in doctrine, life and personality. We need to know both sides of the coin

- Balanced personality of God
 Romans 11:22
 Love + Fear, Rewards + Judgment/discipline
- 2. (Needed) balanced personality of man

a) Barnabas: Son of encouragement/comfort = lover of people

b) Paul: Principled

Clash of personalities over John Mark: Acts 15:36-40

c) Paul probably became balanced: 2 Timothy 4:9-11

The young Paul, who had no family, could not handle Mark. Barnabas is said to have had a family, so he was a better 'father'. The old Paul could now handle Timothy.

Keys to a balanced living
